Sisters and brothers in Christ...



There's no better time to remind one another that we are welcomed as we sit in anticipation, preparing for what is to come. Traditionally December is a month of anxiety and stress, joy and comfort – for all of us. So much to do and so little time to get it all done. And yet we do! It's why I have decided on this theme – a gentle reminder for what we have today, and what will come for all of us.

In Luke's passage on the birth of Christ Jesus, there is one phrase, one part of a verse that often goes unnoticed, its meaning assumed. In verse 12, it begins with "*There will be a sign for you*…" If I asked you today what that sign would be, most – if not all – would tell me it is the star that shone brightly over the stable where Jesus laid in his manger. And that would be right.

Now – fast forward to today; what is that sign for you? What is it in your life that turns you from the chaos of life and points you in the direction of Jesus? Perhaps it is several things, or maybe it's just one. What is it in your life that causes you to pause, to feel inside of yourself the peace that comes from the words – *welcome home*? Perhaps it is a special someone, a friend; maybe it's just the sense of peace you feel in a specific place; or maybe

it's just a star in the heavens or the warmth of the sun. I've spent a lot of time reflecting on this exact phrase these last weeks. God has blessed me with this feeling for 47+ years now.

This is the season for busyness and anticipation and preparation. It is what it is. But it is also a time for quiet and fulfillment and peace. This is what your sign gives you. This is God's gift for you. *"There will be a sign for you..."* I invite you to sit back, put everything aside for a moment, and turn to your sign. Be in his presence. And then pray a prayer of thanks for without this sign, this gift – how would we know the peace and love that we find in the words – welcome home.

May each of you have a blessed Christmas – with family and friends, good food, great memories – but most importantly, the opportunity to experience the wonders of this season of new beginnings and God's continued love.

- 1. Each person will bring one wrapped gift to place under the tree. The gift should be something from home that is no longer needed by the person, and perhaps it is something someone else can use. It could even be a "gag" or humorous gift. There will be a sign up so we know everyone who is participating, and each could receive their gift.
- 2. Players draw numbers to determine what order they will go in.

- 4. The first player selects a gift and opens it.
- 5. The following players select a gift, and if they choose, they could switch gifts with someone else who has already opened a gift.
- 6. After everyone who is participating has received and opened a gift, the first player has the choice to swap their gift for someone else's gift. We will limit the number of swaps to three (3).
- 7. What makes the best "White Elephant gift?" Anything that is funny, old, weird, and yes, even a nice gift.

## **Poinsettias for Hunger & Farm Animals**



This year, as we have done in the past, instead of having a multitude of live poinsettias (which die in a few weeks) given in Memory, or for God's Blessings, or in Honor of someone to decorate the church at Christmas we will be hanging Poinsettia paper ornaments on our Christmas tree in the gathering area at church. Each ornament will have the name of who it was given in memory of, or in honor of, or in thanksgiving for written on it. Each card will be \$10.00 and the money donated will go to ELCA's Good gifts to purchase farm animals or food to donate to needy families throughout the world.

**Poinsettias for Hunger order forms** will be in the bulletin starting Sunday, December 3<sup>rd</sup>. The forms are **due back by Sunday, December 17<sup>th</sup>**.

Let's help feed the hungry! One dairy cow nourishes a family and increases income. A good dairy cow provides more than six gallons of milk a day. Milk from a cow is packed with calcium and essential nutrients to help nourish a family, and the extra milk and dairy products can be sold at the local market for income. When a cow gives birth, a family can trade the calves for other necessities. Or a little pig will provide a source of natural fertilizer to help family crops grow. If needed, taking a pig to the market place is like cashing out a savings account. Or the gift of chicks when they grow up will provide eggs which provide a source of protein and can also help start a small business. ELCA Good gifts catalog also offers an opportunity to provide food to International and State facilities. Please help us feed other.



So, tell me about the coffee and chocolate that is for sale at church. Who is benefiting from this? Is this a fundraiser for Peace? It's not a fundraiser for Peace but a chance to support farmers with fair trade practices!

Well, several years ago, back when Pastor Sarah was here, Pastor Sarah and Barb Myckowiak thought it would be great if we could sell and enjoy fair trade



coffee. That's when we discovered Equal Exchange Fair Trade coffee. The way it works is this. Barb orders coffee, etc., and pays for it with her credit card. The prices are rounded up to make it easy. She keeps track of how much we make each month and gives that money to Jim Bradley who uses it to buy coffee and other supplies for the kitchen. It's that simple! If you see something on their website that you think we should order, please let Barb know!

Here's a little background on Equal Exchange:

### **Our History**

Equal Exchange started with an idea: what if food could be traded in a way that is honest and fair, a way that empowers both farmers and consumers? Our founders - Rink Dickinson, Jonathan Rosenthal and Michael Rozyne - asked this question as they envisioned a trade model that values each part of the supply chain. They decided to take a big risk and started importing fairly traded coffee from Nicaragua in 1986, despite a US embargo against the Sandinista government. A new business was born from this bold act of solidarity with Latin American farmers and Equal Exchange grew from there.

### **Our Mission**

Equal Exchange's mission is to build long-term trade partnerships that are economically just and environmentally sound, to foster mutually beneficial relationships between farmers and consumers and to demonstrate, through our success, the contribution of worker co-operatives and Fair Trade to a more equitable, democratic and sustainable world.

### **Small Farmer Grown**

We've been a proud supporter of authentic fair trade since day one, and to us that means knowing and working directly with the farmers who produce our food. We partner with farmer cooperatives who are democratically organized, sharing resources and decision-making among their members. Collectively, they gain crucial market access and decide how to invest fair trade and organic premiums in their communities. We now source from over 40 small farmer organizations around the world. Our longstanding relationships allow us to secure the best crops, while continuing to develop innovative programs in collaboration with the co-ops, from crop diversification to quality trainings to women's leadership development.
