Backpacks for area kids



Thank you to all! You made it happen.

We set a goal to do 100 backpacks this year, which is an increase of 25 backpacks over last year. We did it! 100 backpacks filled with supplies have been delivered to 5 area schools. All the schools are very grateful for the help for their students. One of the schools was so excited to get them they brought their cart out and even unloaded them from our car. They told us to make sure everyone knows how much these are

appreciated. They use them throughout the year as the students need them as they get many displaced students that come with nothing. By giving those students a backpack, they have something they can call their own. This year, we were also able to put together a box of supplies (tissues, wipes, pencils and dry erase markers) that can be used in the classroom. This helps the teachers as they often buy these supplies out of their own pocket.

This project would not be the success it is without the generous support from all of your donations that helped us reach our goal. We also received a Thrivent Action grant, a Synod grant and also a discount from Meijer.

We had a group of 16 volunteers to help pack these backpacks. They sure proved many hands make light work.

Thank you everyone for your part in this community outreach project.

When they threatened to keep kids back a grade if they failed...and did?


When being sent to the principals' office was nothing compared to the fate that awaited a misbehaving student at home?
