

Peace "Help the Homeless" Ministry...

Last month the Community in Action team decided to begin a new ministry here at Peace. We are calling it "Help the Homeless." Recently Pastor Neil participated in a discussion/forum about the number of homeless encampments in Clinton, Eaton and Ingham counties – two of them here in Charlotte. As winter approaches, the need increases. Together with ELCA-



NWLM Synod Capital Conference congregations, the conference is launching a ministry aimed to assist the PATH (Projects for Assistance in Transition from Homelessness) program that is currently being served through the Housing Services of Mid-Michigan.

The Peace "Help the Homeless" Ministry will begin in January and run through February. Items of great need include:

- Adult socks
- Hats
- Gloves
- Handwarmers
- Blankets

- Hand-held flashlights (pocket size)
- Batteries for the flashlights
- Trash bags 13 and 30 gallon size

A display and collection box will be placed across from Pastor's office after Christmas.

Let's make this our "winter priority" ministry so those facing uncertainty in their housing, and finding themselves homeless, may be protected from the elements during these winter months.

The duo performs the classic jazz ballads of the 1920s–50s, plus a mix of pop and contemporary arranged in a unique style with tight harmonies. Clique has appeared at mid-Michigan events, eateries, senior centers, and outdoor park concerts, as well as out in front of Lansing Concert Band's Jazz Big Band as their featured vocalists. Recent venues include Michigan JazzFest, BluesFest, The Capital Area Humane Society Fur Ball, UrbanBeat, Turner-Dodge House (Lansing Old Town), BrickHaven Brewery (Grand Ledge), The Port craft wine bar (Portland), and various outdoor concert series.

Kelly Sandula-Gruner's music career began at age 4 with piano lessons, and at age 11, she fell in love with the French horn. An obsession with singing came much later! Kelly holds degrees in both music and commercial art, and currently works as a graphic designer. She is a long-time member of the Lansing Concert Band horn section, and featured vocalist with the LCB Big Band. She also performs with the vocal duo Clique, Singers on the Grand, and with local community theatres.

Dan Templin loves to entertain! Fellowship time. It's a great time to gather after watching our youth perform their annual Christmas story and perform on their bells. Pastor Neil and Sandy invite all our members to join us for a **Christmas Open House**, where food and beverages will be provided.

We also invite you (and our youth) to participate in the "White Elephant Christmas Gift Exchange" which we be held during Fellowship time, so we can enjoy one another and share smiles and laughter as we prepare for the Christmas holiday.,

For those who are unsure as to what a "What Elephant Gift Exchange" is, here are some thoughts:

- 1. Each person will bring one wrapped gift to place under the tree. The gift should be something from home that is no longer needed by the person, and perhaps it is something someone else can use. It could even be a "gag" or humorous gift. There will be a sign up so we know everyone who is participating, and each could receive their gift.
- 2. Players draw numbers to determine what order they will go in.
- 3. We will sit at our tables and each gift will be shown so everyone may see.
- 4. The first player selects a gift and opens it.
- 5. The following players select a gift, and if they choose, they could switch gifts with someone else who has already opened a gift.
- 6. After everyone who is participating has received and opened a gift, the first player has the choice to swap their gift for someone else's gift. We will limit the number of swaps to three (3).
- 7. What makes the best "White Elephant gift?" Anything that is funny, old, weird, and yes, even a nice gift.



Poinsettias for Hunger / Farm Animals



This year, as we have done in the past, instead of having a multitude of live poinsettias (which die in a few weeks) given in Memory, or for God's Blessings, or in Honor of someone to decorate the church at Christmas we will be hanging Poinsettia paper ornaments on our Christmas tree in the gathering area at church. Poinsettias for Hunger order forms will be in the bulletin starting Sunday, December 1st. The forms are due back by Sunday, December 15th.


