Did you know... from The Lutheran Handbook....

The Top 10 BIBLE HEROES

The Bible is filled with typical examples of heroism, but another kind of hero inhabits the pages of the Bible – those people who, against all odds, follow God no matter the outcome. There are heroes of faith.

1. Noah

In the face of ridicule from others, Noah trusted God when God chose him to build an ark to save a remnant of humanity from destruction. Noah's trust became part of a covenant with God.

2. Abraham and Sarah

In extreme old age, Abraham and Sarah answered God's call to leave their home and travel to a strange land, where they became the parents of God's people.

3. Moses

Moses, a man with a speech impediment, challenged the Egyptian powers to deliver God's people from bondage. He led a rebellious and contrary people for 40 years through the wilderness and gave them God's law.

4. Rahab

A prostitute who helped Israel conquer the promised land, Rahab was the great-grandmother of King David, and this a part of the family of Jesus himself.

5. David

Great King David, the youngest and smallest member of his family, defeated great enemies, turning Israel into a world power. He wrote psalms, led armies, and confessed his sins to the Lord.

6. Mary and Joseph

These humble peasants responded to God's call to be the parents of the Messiah, although the call came through a pregnancy that was not the result of marriage.

7. The Canaanite Woman

Desperate for her daughter's health, the Canaanite woman challenged Jesus regarding women and race by claiming God's love for all people (Matthew 15:21-28). Because of this, Jesus praised her faith.

8. Peter

Peter was a man quick to speak but slow to think. At Jesus' trial, Peter denied ever having known him. But in the power of forgiveness and through Christ's appointment, Peter became the leader in the early church.

9. Saul/Paul

Originally an enemy and persecutor of Christians, Paul experienced a powerful vision of Jesus, converted, and became the greatest missionary the church has ever known.

10.Phoebe

A contemporary of Paul's Phoebe is believed to have delivered the book of Romans after traveling some 800 miles for Cenchrea near Corinth to Tome. A wealthy woman, she used her influence to travel, protect other believers, and to host worship services in her home.

Luther's Small Catechism (a refresher course)

Many have asked about reviewing Luther's Small Catechism – especially the information covered in our confirmation classes. Continuing with each month, we will review in our newsletters things our confirmation students are required to know and understand in and from Luther's catechism.

This month, we continue with the Sacrament of Holy Communion. It is listed, along with Martin Luther's explanation – taken directly from the Small Catechism.

1. What is the Sacrament of the Altar

Answer: It is the true body and blood of our Lord Jesus Christ under the bread and wine, instituted by Christ himself for us Christians to eat and drink.

2. What is the benefit of such eating and drinking?

Answer: The words "given for you" and "shed for you... for the forgiveness of sin" show us that forgiveness of sin, life, and salvation are given to us in the sacrament through these words, because there is forgiveness of sin, there is also life and salvation.

3. How can bodily eating and drinking do such a thing?

Eating and drinking certainly do not do it, but rather the words that are recorded: "given for you" and "shed for you... for the forgiveness of sin." These words, when accompanied by the physical eating and drinking, are the essential thing in the sacrament, and whoever believes in these very words has what they declare and state, namely, "forgiveness of sin."

4. Who, then, receives this sacrament worthily?

Fasting and bodily preparation are in fact a fine external disciple, but a person who has faith in these words, "given for you" and "shed for you...for the forgiveness of sin," is really worthy and well prepared. However, a person who does not believe these words or doubts them is unworthy and unprepared, because the words "for you" require truly believing hearts.
